**Bible Readings for today: Psalm 69 v.7-10 & 16-18 & Matthew 10 v.24-39** if you do not have a Bible to hand the passage from Matthew is a very real challenge about the cost of being a follower of Christ.

**Reflection:** Over the past few weeks we have been travelling with the disciples as they in turn journey with Jesus, hearing his teaching and seeing the miracles he performed. Last week we saw them go out on mission themselves with Jesus' instructions and in the power of the Spirit. This week's reading is challenging as it sets out very clearly the cost of following Jesus as well as the blessings. A true disciple will need to love Jesus more than anyone or thing else. Whilst Jesus came to bring peace, a consequence of being his follower might well mean conflict even between ones nearest and dearest. These are indeed powerful verses. So today I would like us to think together about the qualities needed to be a faithful follower of Christ. To do this we are going to use an acrostic, so take your piece of paper and write the letters in the word disciple down the page:-

**D**...is for the discipline that we all need when following Jesus is tough.

**I**...is for the inspiration we need to find new ways to tell our stories.

**S**...is for service, a vital part of our discipleship, whatever our circumstances.

**C**...is for caring, again at the very compassionate heart of our faith.  
**I**...for me, is about identifying my imperfections and asking God's forgiveness.  
**P**...is for our prayer life, the power of prayer so important at this time.  
**L**...is the "perfect love, that drives out fear" (1J 4 v.18) in the Father's heart.  
**E**...is for exhortation, the need for us all to proclaim the good news.  
I wonder what qualities you have chosen. In all these things God strengthens us and knows our weakness. Let us pray for God's continuing guidance in our desire to be the best disciples we can be. Amen (*idea for the acrostic from Roots*)
