
Ripon And Lower Dales Circuit Newsletter

Book review in 100 words



'Finding God in a Culture of Fear: Discovering hope in God's kingdom' by Joanne Cox-Darling. Published last year, in this inspirationally challenging book Joanne Cox-Darling offers insights to help the reader engage more fully in their daily lives with a fresh attentiveness to the Holy Spirit.

I found this to be a book to be one I would revisit, and one designed for sharing. Included are discussion questions for fuelling positive conversations around discipleship; about how we might approach mission and evangelism. The title and subheading demonstrate a prophetic perception of our times and it is spoken clearly throughout the chapters.
