Bible Readings for today: Psalm 145 v.8-14 & Matthew 11 v.16&19 & 25-30 if you do not have a Bible to hand this passage sees Jesus talking about confounding expectations on his ministry. He also reminds his listeners that God reveals things to the simple rather than the "wise" ones of the day.

Reflection: I would like to begin today's reflection with some words from the President of the Methodist Conference Revd. Richard Teal's presidential address. Richard spoke movingly of the challenges we all face as people of faith at this time. He reminded us:- "God doesn't practise social distancing, but becomes close and personal, close enough to infect us with grace and love. Inspiring words indeed and encouraging to us all as we try to navigate the minefield of emerging from lockdown and planning for the future. Jesus' words in Matthew ch.11 remind everyone that neither John the Baptist or Jesus himself carried out their ministry in the way people expected of them

and that God reveals God's self to the most unlikely in society – in Jesus' day, children, tax collectors, women, sinners, the lowest of the low as seen through human eyes. Jesus also invites us to share his yoke, something that is unique to Matthew. Given what happens to Jesus on the cross this might not first appear to be something we want to do. However, Jesus is actually offering to share our burdens and free of the weight of weariness and fear we can then see God's revealing the love and grace that comes only through following Jesus as our Lord and our Saviour. What a message for our current circumstances!! Let us, in turn, share this message with the world in so much need and help do our part to bear one another's burdens with gentleness and grace. Amen.

Prayers of Intercession: O God of healing love, we pray for all who are in hospital, hospice or ill at home in these anxious days, continuing to hold before you those who are suffering with Covid 19. We remember in our prayers all NHS staff whatever their role and especially commend to you the work of hospital Chaplains. We pray for all whose lives are ripped apart by war, violence and abuse and for all who encounter prejudice and live in fear. We pray for our friends and families who we miss so dearly and for our church family with whom we join in worship and prayer. Strengthen us all, Lord of life, to live to your praise and glory. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.
