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This year farmers across this country have been faced with floods, draughts and wet weather for bringing in the harvest, which due to the poor conditions as meant crops have been affected and the harvest reduced.

A further difficulty has been farming during the Pandemic of 2020. Reading Galatians, chapter 6, verse 9

'So let us not grow weary in doing what is right, for we will reap at harvest time, if we do not give up.'

A reflection by Revd. Gareth

This verse which sits within the final chapter of Paul's letter to the Galatians is urging the church to bear one another's burdens. It also follows on from Paul speaking about the Fruit of the Spirit which comes through living by the Spirit.

The above verse feels especially pertinent with all that has and is happening this year, not least with a difficult harvest time.

Of course, Paul is using the imagery of harvest to refer to matters of faith, pointing directly to God, Holy Spirit. We too can draw upon that

same imagery and consider what it is we are sowing in our own lives. Are we seeking to sow and grow in the Spirit of God?

This one verse does not sit alone, and I encourage you to read the whole chapter if not the whole letter in its six chapters. This verse does give us a taste of the hope which comes from life lived by the Spirit. Of life lived for and with God. Paul reminded the churches in Galatia of this hope, encouraging them not to give up doing what is right, that a harvest would come. The point being that you reap whatever you sow.

Now is the time, just like yesteryear for doing what is right. With all the struggles in life we face, let us not abandon Our God who sustains us, let us not grow weary in doing what is right, for we will reap at harvest time, if we do not give up. Let us keep going with God who does not and will not abandon us, and may God keep growing in us the fruit of the Spirit.
