In the quiet ask Gods Spirit to bring to mind those areas of your life He would have you confess.

Reflection

Lent is a time of preparation for us as we move towards the Easter moment of awe and wonder. In days gone by that preparation was for those that were seeking to be baptised into the church on Easter Day.

All through Lent they would be asked to prepare themsleves by fasting and they would have received teaching on Resisting Temptation, of the true cost of Following Jesus in Taking up ones Cross, the importance of keeping oneself free from wrong behaviours and habits and many other teachings too, all describing what it means to called a follower of Jesus, to be able to call themselves Christian and be part of the Church of God, so they can be sure of the committment they were making at that time of Baptism.

In this passage the whole thing is laid bare. The requirements of being able to be called 'Follower of Jesus, Christian, part of the Church of Jesus.

And over Lent we too echo this preparation in our giving up of something, or focus on Gods word for 40 days, and the lectionary teachings set for each year.

And so we come to todays reading, and one that most of us will know so very well. It is one of the few passages that if I mention just the first three words, most people will be able to tell me the rest and the chapter and verse without even thinking.

But it contains the whole essence of why you and I are here today, and how we need to live our lives.

For God so loved the world!! What an amazing statement For God so loved the world It's awesome

Just savour what that means. For God so loved the world!!

God so LOVED you and me that he allowed the most precious thing in the world to be risked as a sacrifice for all the wrongs we would be doing, have done and still do.

But before we go too far lets look at that reading in full.

Reading - John ch 3 vs 14 - 21

And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

'For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.

'Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.

Those who believe in him are not condemned; but those who do not believe are condemned already, because they have not believed in the name of the only Son of God. And this is the judgement, that the light has come into the world, and people loved darkness rather than light because their deeds were evil. For all who do evil hate the light and do not come to the light, so that their deeds may not be exposed.

But those who do what is true come to the light, so that it may be clearly seen that their deeds have been done in God.'

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Let's put a bit of context on this. This passage is when Jesus is teaching Nicodemus. Nicodemus is a teacher himself, and has come to Jesus to question him and get honest answers. Nicodemus is a bit confused about that phrase 'You need to be Born Again' and so Jesus goes on to tell him that The Son of Man - who Nicodemus would know is a reference to a dream that Daniel had (Daniel 7 vs 13) - The Son of many would become the salvation of all who look to Him.

And so we come to this wonderful and amazing statement that Jesus makes.

For God so loved the world!!

Gods' love is central to all we are, and all we can ever be. God has loved us from the very moment he thought of us, each and every one.

God created this world, and he loved it - it is VERY good He proclaimed. And yet, we all know that we are a wayward people. This has been the pattern forever, since the first time Adam and Eve forgot themselves and were convinced by the devil to rebel.

And you and I, have we never rebelled, have we never gone our own way, have we never forgotten that we owe all to God's love.

When we said Yes to Jesus call for us to follow Him, did we never rebel ever again?

And yet, God loves us so much that He wants to put this right. Not that we deserve this in any way, but simply that God loves us enough to want us to be right with him.

And so He sent His only Son, to be the sacrifice.

God loves His people enough to give them, to give us, His Son.

God so loved the world that He gave us His Son, that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.

Jesus tells Nicodemus that a light that has come into the world. We all know how good the light is, we know how comforting and renewing light is. But

light is no good if we are not to look into it, to allow it to flood our lives and reveal to us all that needs to be revealed.

No so long ago I had a splinter in my hand, it was one of those nasty, little, stingy splinters, and the first thing I did was reach for the tweezers to pluck it out. But I could not see it, so I went to the window where the light was shining in and there, in the light, I got hold of that splinter and pulled it out. The pain stopped, the relief came through and I could go about my work again.

Now I want to pause and remind us all that we are in Lent, a time of preparation, and for those that would be followers this next bit is vital.

You see, our human tendency is to walk in darkness, to hide what we know to be wrong in our lives and hope that no one notices. But this is not God's way.

The Light has come so that all may be revealed, and just as the light revealed my little and irritating splinter, so this light reveals all that is wrong with each of us. Now that is a frightening thing no doubt. And that is why it is so challenging and a big decision, not to be taken lightly. For when we approach the light in the right way we are revealed to be less than we would want to be. All laid bare in front of God Himself, and as a result revealed to ourselves too.

And this is why God sent His Son into the world. So that as we approach the light that is God Himself, we are also approaching the Son who is we know is the Light of the World and our forgiveness and our salvation.

This is the Love that God has, that in order to us to be with Him, we need to be willing to be revealed in the light for what we are. But that Jesus can, if we believe (and we must), Jesus can take all that away, not condemn but give us new life. Truly to start again, to be Born again.

Lent is a time of preparation, not just for new believers, but for those of us how have believed for a long time too.

Have any of us wandered from the light a bit? Come back to the light, all is not lost.

God so loved the world that He gave us His Son, that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. For you and for me Amen.
